Theme of the conference

The topic of this year's edition of Digital Legal Talks is again dedicated to law and digital technologies. In the context of this general theme, researchers are welcome to address various aspects that correspond to the main lines of research of the Digital Legal Lab. These are:

- 1 Responsible data sharing & regulation of AI
- 2 Digitalization of justice systems & dispute resolution
- 3 Technology for law & legal practice
- 4 Digital platforms as infrastructures & enforcers of public interests
- 5 Enforcement & the use of technology (incl. DSA, DMA, AI Act, Data Act)
- 6 Data protection & cybersecurity
- 7 Other: contributions targeting other topics in the field of law & technology are also welcome, but may receive less priority depending on the total amount of submissions

There are no specific guidelines as regards formatting or referencing style.
